In this edition of RMCREF Spotlight, we feature two recent releases from the [MIT Concrete Sustainability Hub](#) (CSHub): their [2020 Annual Report](#) and the report [A Scientific Investigation into Concrete Durability](#), performed in cooperation with [Oregon State University](#) (OSU) and the [University of New Brunswick](#) (UNB).

The just-released [CSHub Annual Report](#) includes comprehensive details on the year's research releases, informational webinars, presentations to local, state, and national groups, meetings with governmental officials and their wide-ranging communications outreach and national media coverage of CSHub work. Despite the challenges of COVID-19, the researchers were able to continue their work unmitigated, as evidenced by the detailed Annual Report.

The CSHub also recently released the report [A Scientific Investigation into Concrete Durability](#). This project was performed in collaboration with OSU and UNB to help improve the durability of concrete pavements by improving the scientific understanding of pavement distresses, especially regarding alkali-silica reaction (ASR) and freeze-thaw (FT). *Please note: the study file is over 19MB.*
